It is staggering to know that as of January 21, 2020, more than 2,700 people have been hospitalized and 60 have died from using vape products nationwide. More troubling is that vaping disproportionately affects teens, who are seven times more likely to vape than adults.

Although the purchase of tobacco and vaping products is illegal for anyone under 21 years of age, in the last two years alone we have seen a five-fold increase in patients under 21 who have reported using tobacco, which includes vaping and e-cigarettes.
