Pharmacy Services:

The Pharmacy Department provides comprehensive services on both campuses, Palomar Medical Center Escondido and Palomar Medical Center Poway.

The facilities have implemented an automated distribution model, consisting of inventory management and automated dispensing cabinets.Clinical services include pharmacokinetics, anticoagulation management, total parenteral nutrition, renal dosing, and antibiotic utilization evaluation, and multidisciplinary rounds in our ICU & Trauma areas, Code team participation.

Pharmacists also provide discharge counseling on all newly started patients on warfarin or DOAC's.

Palomar Medical Center Escondido also has an outpatient oncology infusion center and outpatient pharmacy that provides specialty drugs and a meds to beds program. Palomar Medical Center Escondido is a teaching site for the University of California, San Diego, KGI School of Pharmacy, and primary site for the PGY1 pharmacy residency program and PGY2 program in Infectious Diseases.

Serving on a host of committees and rounding teams, pharmacists are vital members of the health care team within Palomar Health.

Requirements for Eligibility: Completion of accredited PGY1 pharmacy residency or equivalent, Pharmacy School Graduate, CA licensure, personal interview, submission of a letter of interest, curriculum vitae, pharmacy school transcript, three letters of recommendation and optional passport photo.

Completion or board certification in pharmacotherapy is preferable but not required. Membership in the Infectious Disease Society of America (IDSA) and/or American College

of Clinical Pharmacy (ACCP) with specialty preference is strongly encouraged.

PGY2 INFECTIOUS DISEASES RESIDENCY

PGY2 Program Purpose: PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in advanced or specialized practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care that improves medication therapy. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency should possess competencies that qualify them for clinical pharmacist and/or faculty positions and position them to be eligible for attainment of board certification in that practice area (when board certification for the practice area exists).

OVERVIEW OF PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The **Palomar Health PGY2 Infectious Diseases** residency program will be designed to develop the resident's skill as a clinical specialist in infectious diseases. The goal will be to provide the candidate the skill and experience required to lead an antibiotic stewardship program at a community hospital in concordance with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) core elements and to meet the requirements designated to fill the role as a pharmacist with advanced training in infectious disease. The resident will gain experience and develop best practice in the clinical pharmacy infectious disease and will provide optimal antimicrobial therapy to the patients and community we serve. In addition to daily patient care skills, the resident will develop skills in maintaining the required antimicrobial usage measurements to comply with the CDC core elements and those required by the National Health and Safety Network. The resident will act as a co-chairman for the anti-microbial subcommittee; attend medical staff

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REQUIREMENTS FOR COMPLETION

- > Exit Interview with both Director of Pharmacy and Residency Program Director

The resident will develop and implement strategic initiatives and new programs, and lead clinical practice in accordance with Palomar Health Pharmacy Department. The resident will work closely with the Antimicrobial Stewardship physician, and other disciplines including the microbiology laboratory, infections control practitioners, nursing, information technology and other departments consistent with antimicrobial stewardship. Throughout the year, the resident will be expected to independently manage and precept PGY-1 residents and pharmacy students. It will be an expectation and goal at the end of the experience that the resident will be qualified and prepared to obtain certification in Antibiotic Stewardship (ABS) such as the Society of Infectious Disease Pharmacist (SIDP) or Making a Difference in Infectious Disease. (MAD-ID), and be prepared to obtain board certification in infectious disease.
